Our guests often ask for our advice on where to go and what to look for in the surrounding mountains. We are also interested in discovering new places and that's why we drive and walk in the Himalayas a lot. It turned out that there is not a lot of information on the Internet about our valley.

We have not found good travel guides either. So I decided to write my own guidebook about the Kullu valley.



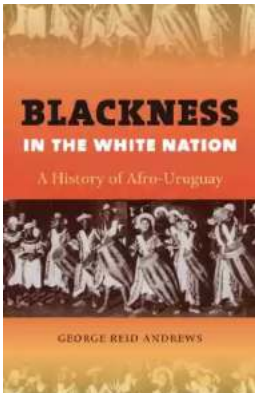
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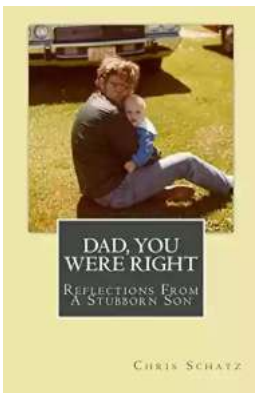
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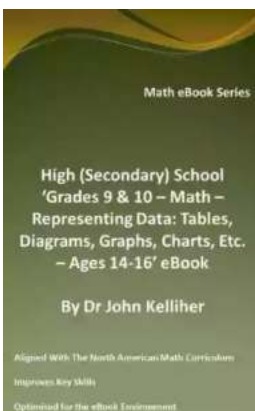
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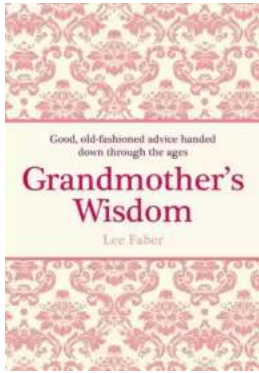
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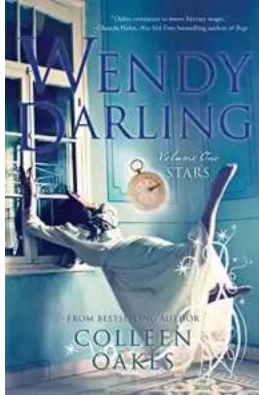
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
