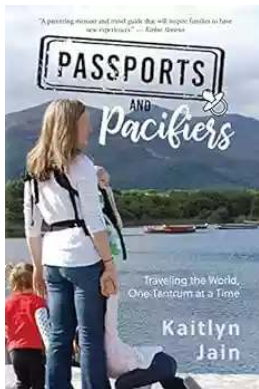

Lost in Translation in Tokyo

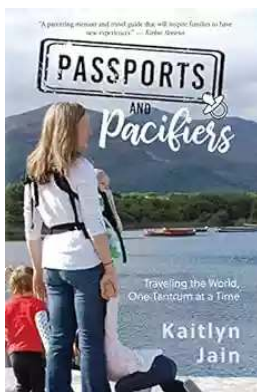
